Home Preparations: Taken from the Humane Alternatives Products Brochure

*Drain Unclogger*pour 1/2 C baking soda followed by 1/2 C vinegar into slow moving drain.

Ant Repellent: In kitchen wash countertops, cabinets and floors with equal amounts of vinegar and water.

Roach Repellent: Place whole bay leaves in several locations around kitchen.

Coffee and Wine Spills on Clothing: Blot the fresh spill with a cloth soaked with club soda.

Oil and Grease on Driveways may be easily removed by sprinkling the area with kitty litter, allowing it to absorb, then removing it with shovel or broom.

Water Softener: 1/4 C vinegar in final rinse.

Oil stains: white chalk rubbed into stain before laundering.

Glass cleaner: white vinegar and water or rubbing alcohol and water.

Copper cleaner: paste of lemon juice, salt, and flour.

Household cleanser: baking soda.

Stainless steel polish: baking soda or mineral oil for shining, vinegar to remove spots.

Toilet bowl cleaner: vinegar.

Mildew remover: Lemon juice and salt, or white vinegar and salt.

To remove Odors from spills or pet accidents on carpet or furniture, blot the fresh stain with a cloth soaked with cider vinegar.
