Members can deposit funds into their accounts which are already being used to give discounts and track sales. You may be thinking, why would I want to open a positive charge? Hey everybody!

Leah Gramitt, board President here. So, we've survived another U.P. winter! (Granted this one was pretty mild.) This makes U.P. winter number five for my family. I've been recently thinking about the co-op and how it's evolved since we moved to Ironwood. A lot has changed since I first visited Ironwood in the Fall of 2007 on our tour of the western U.P. Since that first visit the co-op has gained fresh organic produce every Friday, a bulk section, a web presence (I didn't even know the co-op existed when I stumbled upon it 5 years ago...and I was doing a lot of online research about Ironwood), local products, new freezers, fresh artisan bread and over 220 members! The new board, voted in last November, acknowledges the co-op's accomplishments but also recognizes there is still lots of work to do. Sales are modestly, yet steadily increasing each year and now it's apparent this co-op is ready for the next step.

I'm happy to report we have a great group of board members that are highly motivated and in the store a lot. We gratefully welcome back Terry Davis as Board Secretary. Karl Jensen, the board's new treasurer, has been regularly working with Lori, our bookkeeper, as she transitions from relying heavily on an outside accountant, to doing almost all the bookkeeping in house. With an updated computer and QuickBooks software, the co-op is saving hundreds of dollars a month! (A special thank you to David Traczyk's accounting office for helping make it a smooth transition.) Brenda Harville, in addition to serving as the new Vice President, has taken on ordering, stocking and maintaining the produce section. I've been focusing on coordinating the new efforts, tightening up our operations, identifying our weaknesses and strengths, reducing wasted spending and am committed to improving our customers' experience. Megan Fuller, recently appointed interim board member, has taken on the job of Outreach Coordinator, heading up the first co-op customer survey in nearly six years. She's currently organizing a fundraising garage/bake sale and can be seen many days of the week passing out product samples and helping maintain the co-op. Co-op member, Stacey Kooiker Brostoski, has volunteered her expertise in business operations and finance to help us get on course for a successful future.

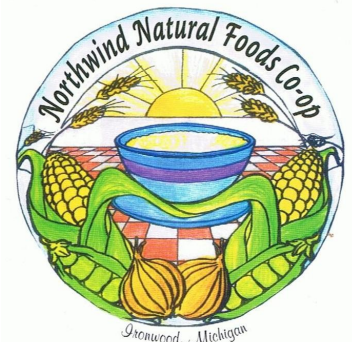
